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Welcome to the first newsletter from Bowmer + Kirkland, regarding construction of the replacement school building at the existing Highams Park School.

Project Information

The project comprises demolition of existing teaching spaces and the construction of a new three-storey building, with associated external works and sports ground provision.

The project will consolidate the gradual expansion of the school since the 1930s and reduce the number of buildings from 11 to 5. It will create improved department organisation and student movement around site and remove accessibility barriers caused by the site gradient changes and step access.

We thank you for your patience and understanding during our enabling works and the erection of site hoarding.

Official works on site will begin early November with installation of the temporary school buildings to the southern end of the site. The delivery of these buildings will be via Beverley Road and the delivery of the accommodation units will require some parking restrictions which we'd like to explain and discuss with you.

We therefore invite you to attend an open evening on Wednesday October 30 at 17:30-19:30 in the school's main hall where our site team will talk you through our plans which have been developed in consultation with Waltham Forest Highways Department.

The new site layout permits sharing of facilities with neighbouring schools and the community, whilst freeing up more space for hard and soft landscaped areas. We will be retaining the majority of mature trees around the boundary with a planting strategy across site which will connect to the memorial garden.

We would like to thank you in advance for your patience and cooperation during the construction period. We will keep you updated on forthcoming works with regular newsletters and community meetings.

- Prioritising environmental issues to protect the natural environment and minimising negative impacts.
- Optimising the use of resources, including minimising carbon throughout the value chain.
- Engaging with the community to improve the local environment in a meaningful way.

Value their Workforce

Constructors must create a supportive, inclusive, and healthy workplace, by:

- Actively encouraging and supporting an inclusive and diverse workplace.
- Proactively supporting safe working, mental and physical wellbeing at work.
- Providing workplaces that are, well maintained, clean and secure from physical and biological hazards.
